MISSION HILLS EXPANSION REVEALED AT ANNUAL MEETING

focal point of the March 1, 2009 annual meeting conducted by Chairman Armen Hampar in the Deukmeijan Ballroom was the announcement that a 44-bed expansion of the Skilled Nursing Facility in Mission Hills and additional parking are being planned, with a projected completion date of October 2012. This expansion will replace the 42 beds lost when the Ararat Convalescent Hospital in Eagle Rock is closed at some future date.

Nazar Ashijan, Real Estate Chairman, noted that in 2008 the Rockhaven property was sold to the City of Glendale for \$8.25 million, a net gain of \$4.7 million. The many restrictions required by the city made it too costly to develop the Rockhaven property. and an appropriate replacement site was not found. The sale resulted in a reserve fund of \$6.58 million available for new construction for additions to Mission Hills. Bob Simonian of Sobin-Harte Architects described preliminary troduced the chairladies of the Guilds plans for the project.

Chairman Hampar recognized Administrators Violette Alahaidovan (Eagle Rock Convalescent Hospital),

Rita Noravian (Assisted Living, Mission Hills), and Margo Babikian (Skilled Nursing, Mission Hills) who offered complete reports on their facilities. Donors and volunteers were sincerely

Treasurer Nazar Ashjian gave high marks to Controller Derik Ghookasian "for safeguarding the Home's assets." Financial statements were audited and approved by an outside CPA. Reports were given by Cindy Kaloostian (Annual Fund), Nora Hampar (Ballroom), Gary Kaloostian (Casino Night), Dr. Gary Lulejian (Endowment), Art Arutian (Plagues, Memorials and Fund Raising), and Dr. Joseph Ouzounian (Web Site Chair), who reported that he had worked with Web Designer Hovel Babikian, producing a more robust site at www.ararathome.org. Michael Surmeian, (new picnic chairman) thanked Richard Jebejian, Ken Khteian and Gabe Kaprelian for their years of dedicated work and leadership.

Coordinator Barbara Poladian inwhich work consistently and creatively to raise funds for Ararat. Reports were given by Sue Abrahamian (Ladies Auxiliary), Allise Arakelian Harte (Massis

A grand total of \$231,000 was turned over by the Guilds, \$60,000 of that amount being earmarked for the Endowment Fund.

Maggie Goschin enthusiastically presented a tenyear overview of the Ararat-Eskijian Museum, which continues to expand its collection of books and objects of art. Hagop Arshagouni reported that for ten years he and his wife Marilyn have conducted the Quiz Bowl for students representing Armenian day schools in the Southland. The questions are derived from the Armenian Timeline Book authored by the Arshagounis.

Before adjournment a standing ovation was given to Beatrice Malkhasian, Executive Secretary, for her devoted service to the Board and to Ararat Home. Thanks to all who attended. Join us next year!


BOGOS "BEDO" BULANIK, ARTIST

he last few issues featured four of Ararat Home's residents, giving a brief account of their lives before they came to Ararat. Our featured resident this month is Mr. Bogos Bedros Bulanik, currently a resident in the Skilled Nursing Facility. I think it is safe to say that if he hadn't come to Ararat Home from another nurs-

ing facility in Canoga Park in July 2008, he would not be in the condition he is. Mrs. Margo Babikian, Executive Director, told me that he was extremely ill when he was admitted. And now, although not fully mobile, he gets around with a walker and exercises daily on a stationery bicycle, as well as working with light weights. That is a far cry from iust a few months ago! Another factor in his improved condition is that he is allowed to operate according to his own schedule. This feeling of independence lifts his spirits and contributes to his well being and outlook.

Mr. Bulanik, or Bedo, as he signs his name to his art work, was born in Istanbul, Turkey in 1932. He came to the U.S. in 1956 and worked in different trades while attending the Schern Art School in Los Angeles, studying painting and ceramics. His art was displayed in various group art shows, and he won several awards with the Armenian Allied Arts Association. While continuing with his art, Mr. Bulanik and his brother-in-law, Vahe Artan, opened

In addition to his passion for art, Bogos Bulanik was an avid world traveler. An incomplete list of the various countries he visited includes all of Western and Eastern Europe, numer-

2 ARARAT HOME ANNUAL FUND 3 TIMELINE QUIZ BOWL


May 14, 1926 - February 27, 2009

Ararat Home suffered a great loss in the death of John Yaldezian. This courageous gentleman had served Ararat Home for over 22 vears, including two terms as Chairman of the Board of Trustees: 1999 to 2002 and 2005 to 2007. During part of his second term, he was diagnosed with cancer, and given an ominous prognosis. Being the fighter that he is, he continued to serve the Home as Chairman. and then as Vice Chairman, until his passing. He will be sorely missed by all who knew him,

especially his dear wife Alice, his children, grandchildren, interment. khunamies and twin brother Chris. John Yaldezian passed away peacefully on February 27, 2009, after a valiant three year of his loving family.

John Yaldezian was born on May 14, 1926, in Chicago, IL, beating his twin brother Chris into the world by 15 minutes. There was a special bond between them as they worked tirelessly for the Church, the Western Diocese and the Knights of Vartan Brotherhood. While pursuing his career in the printing trades, he served as president of the Web Newspapers license and worked in that field.

Not only will Ararat Home feel John's loss, but so will other organizations that he served so faithfully; the Western Diocese of the Armenian Church, St. Peter Armenian Church, Knights of Vartan Brotherhood and the Masons. He served all of these



organizations, not merely as a member, but as an outstanding leader.

On Thursday evening, March 5, over 70 members of the Knights of Vartan conducted a moving funeral service as they bid farewell in St. Peter Armenian Church. The Masons performed their service following the Knights of Vartan service. The church was filled to capacity that evening as well as the following day, March 6, for the regular funeral service. A procession of cars over two miles long proceeded to Forest Lawn Cemetery for the

Service and dedication are the words that best describe John's passion. He was part of the group that founded St. Peter fight, at his home in Woodland Hills, California, in the presence Armenian Church in Van Nuys, CA., and served as teacher and Sunday School superintendent, and Parish Council Chairman several times. John Yaldezian served as Treasurer and Chairman of both the Western Diocese Council and Assembly. Vehapar Karekin I recognized his dedication to the Armenian Church by honoring him with the St. Nerses Shnorhali Medal.

He was a member of Sevan Lodge of the Knights of Vartan for 50 years, serving in various positions at both the local (two Pressmen's Union. Later, he obtained his real estate broker's terms as Commander) and national (Grand Council) levels. John was co-Chairman of three national conventions. He remained active in Sevan, always providing wise counsel. He was also dedicated to the Masons, serving as Master of Zenith Lodge in Van Nuys and helped establish Ararat Lodge, an Armenian Masonic Lodge, in Sierra Madre, CA.

On Sunday, March 29, 2009. twenty-eight students in the eighth grade, who attend Armenian day schools in

the greater Los Angeles area, took part in the Tenth Annual Armenian History Timeline Quiz Bowl at the Ararat Home of Los Angeles in Mission Hills. This unique event brings together young people from virtually all the Armenian day schools in the region for an afternoon of friendly academic interaction.

In a competition which lasted over two hours, the students answered a series of questions on Armenian history and culture. They demonstrated a familiarity with material spanning three millennia and ranging over topics as varied as history, geography, literature. science, the arts, and religion. The

gian-Demirdjian School finished in first place, winning a check for \$1,000,00. Second place award of \$750.00 went to the Chamlian School. The Pilibos School took the third place award of \$500.00. Each of the other participating schools received a check for \$250.00. They included the Ferrahian School, the Merdinian School, the Sahag-Mesrob School, the Armenian Sisters' Academy, and the St. Gregory School.

All participating students received trophies and certificates. In addition. they took home a mug especially de-

signed for the Quiz Bowl, featuring graphics from the Timeline itself, thanks to generous donations from friends of the Ararat Home. Harold Marublian. Vice-Chairman of the Board, presented each student with an Ararat pin.
